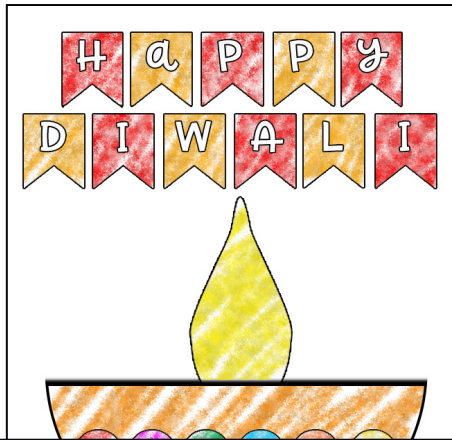

Step 2: Have your child decorate the various parts of the card – get creative with crayons, colored pencils, paint, glitter etc.

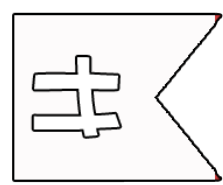
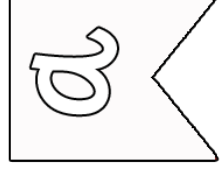
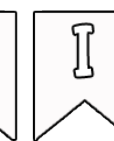
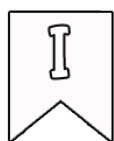
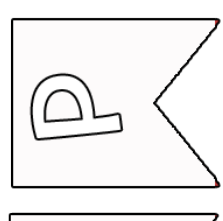
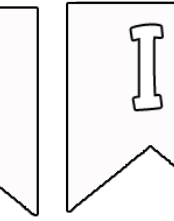
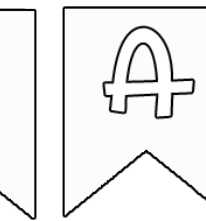
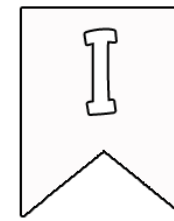
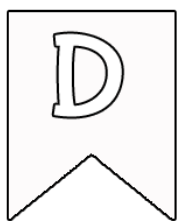
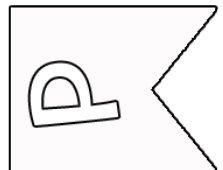
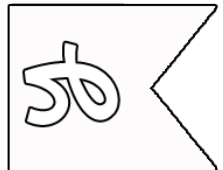
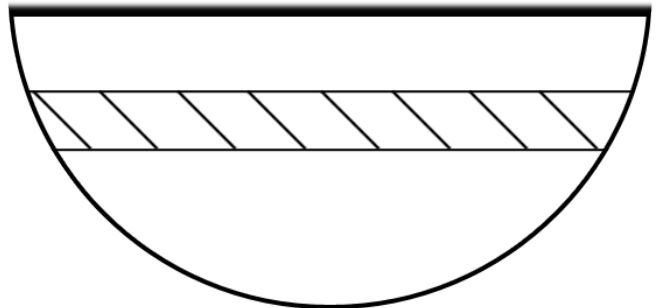
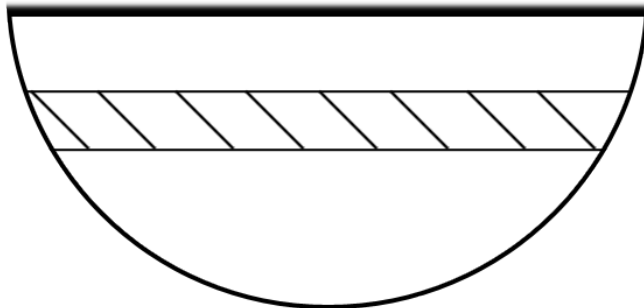
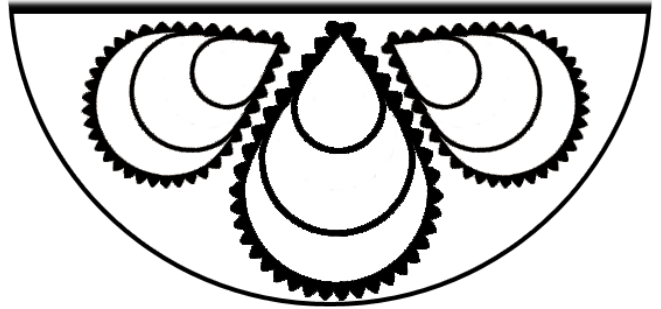
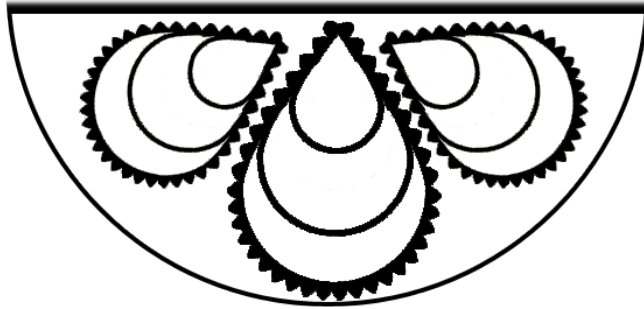
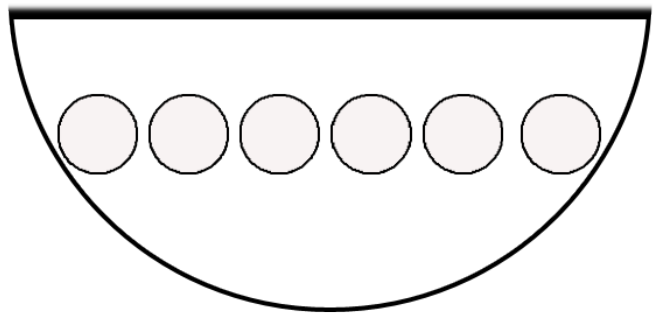
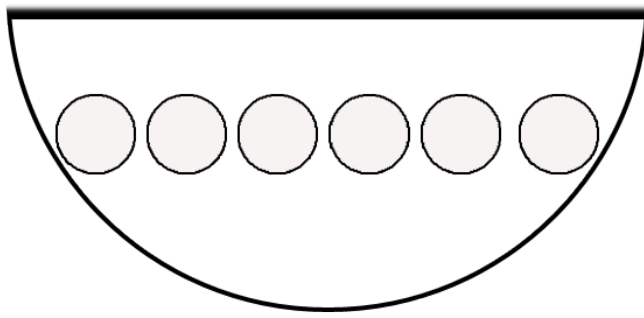
Step 3: Cut and/or supervise your child cut the decorated shapes
